

Call for Book Chapter Abstracts: The Future Past of Tourism

In 1950, 25 million tourists undertook an international holiday whereas today international tourism has reached 1.2 billion arrivals. Why? Mobility, increases in wealth, new economies and the experience economy.

Set against this remarkable growth, *The Future Past of Tourism* is a new book that sets out to assess the critical development of tourism through history and predicting what its future will be. Using a [transformation and evolution paradigm](#) from future studies, authors are asked to identify milestones in the development of tourism, hospitality and events, thus identifying why change occurred.

This type of writing is demonstrated in the paper by Yeoman and McMahon-Beattie (2017) on the [history of Revenue Management](#) or Godley and William's (2009) paper about [changing food consumption patterns](#).

The book will be published as part of Channel View's ***The Future of Tourism Series*** (<https://channelviewpublications.wordpress.com/2016/08/03/new-series-the-future-of-tourism/>).

Each chapter will be between 5000 – 6000 words. The book will comprise of 18-20 chapters. It is anticipated that 80% of a chapter's content will be focused on the critical evaluation of the historical development of your chosen topic. Target markets for the book are researchers and postgraduate students.

- Title of proposed chapter.
- Author(s) details (with lead author contact email address).
- Rationale for topic/area choice and overview of the proposed chapter to include key milestones in the historical development of your selected topic/area.
- Tentative future milestones/developments for your selected topic/area.

Submission of first draft of your chapter: 1st April 2018

Final submission of chapters: 30th September 2018
